ENGLISH DEPARTMENT FACULTY

ENGLISH COURSES

Four years of English are required to graduate from VCHS. The honors classes are intended for students who are highly skilled and motivated in English and who possess a strong work ethic. Advanced Placement (AP) classes allow students to take a college-level course in a supportive environment; students should expect corresponding rigor and time required. Juniors and seniors who desire a fifth year of English, may select from the other course offerings.

This map is a general planning tool, intended to show the course and typical student tracks. Students who opt for honors and Advanced Placement English classes follow a fixed progression if they remain on the honors/AP track. Junior and seniors opting for college preparatory classes select from a list of electives to fulfill their four-year English requirements. Students may deviate from the map and should consult with the counselors and teachers to find the best classes to meet their academic and spiritual goals. Courses offered may vary year to year.



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
